RATNAPITH COLLEGE: At a Glance

Ratnapith College was started on the 1st of September, 1978 by the leading citizens of Chapar, Bahalpur area. It was called Chapar-Bahalpur College in its inception. After three years, the name was changed to Ratnapith College to signify a wider concept and a historical legacy. 'Ratnapith' is the name of one of the four divisions of the ancient kingdom of Kamrupa. The site of the College is within the ancient 'Ratnapith' which had a glorious past and rich heritage. The College has been renamed after it to associate it with its past glory. The college is situated at Bahalpur, Nathpara under Chapar Circle of Dhubri District.



The College has been imparting education in the Three Years Degree course and Correspondence courses through Institute of Distance and Open Learning (IDOL), GU and Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University (KKHSOU).

The College was affiliated to Gauhati University in the year 1983-84. It is now included in 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956. The College has made rapid progress in the vast areas covering more than 80 Bighas of land. The College has emerged as a premier higher educational institution of western Assam with modern ICT enabled class rooms, automated library including digital library facilities, sophisticated Reading Rooms, Administrative Buildings, Teachers' Common Room, Internet wi-fi connected campus, Girls Common Room, Students Union Hall, Principal's Quarter, Guards Quarters, Warden's Quarter, Sports House, Auditorium, Women's Hostel, Boys' Hostel, Guest House, Workshop, Roads and Avenues, Open Air Theatre, massive Plantation of Trees, Luxuriant Growth, Orchard of various Fruits and Nuts, Fishery and Playground with Pavilion which looks like a Mini Santi Niketan (as the prominent Poet Navakanta Baruah termed it)

While singing the College song, the students are pledged to bringing light out of darkness and knowing the unknown. The symbol in the flag carries the message of morality DAM, DAYA, DAN. The motto summarizes the objects of the College in to the words "Learning itself is achievement in life".



Courses of Study

Introduction of FYUGP by Gauhati University

Structure-wise, the present Bachelor's Degree programme under the CBCS is a 3-year degree programme at the end of which, a student will be awarded a Bachelor's Degree in Arts, Science, or Commerce. Bachelor's Course under CBCS and Bachelor's Course under the FYUGP of NEP are different in many ways. FYUGP is formally launched on 3rd June, 2023 by our honourable Chief Minister, Dr Himanta Biswa Sarmah in the BKB auditorium of the Gauhati University.

Duration

GU-FYUGP (GU Four-year Undergraduate Programme) is a 4-year undergraduate degree programme aligned with NEP 2020.

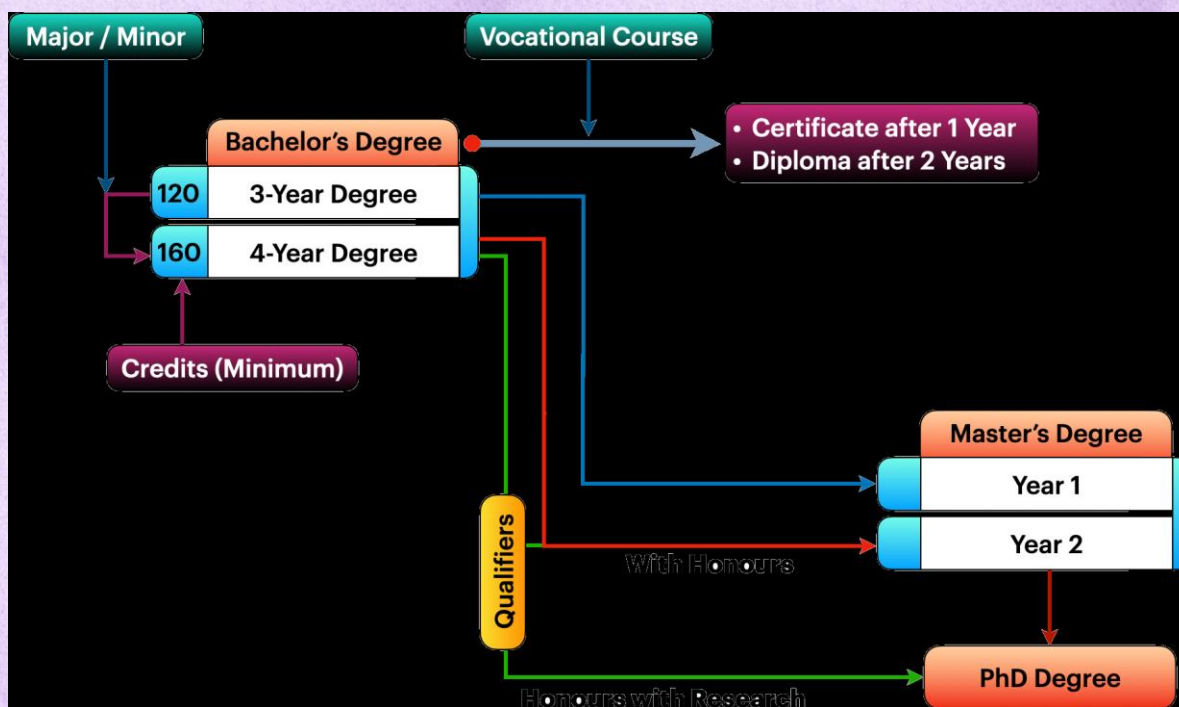
Exits & Entries

GU-FYUGP supports multiple exits & entries. Each year, a student can exit the programme and can enter at a later time.

Degree, Diploma & Certificate

On exit, a student gets a

- Certificate at the end of the 1st year
- Diploma at the end of the 2nd year
- Bachelor's Degree with Major & Minors at the end of 3rd year
- Bachelor's Degree (Honours) & Bachelor's Degree (Honours) with Research at the end of the 4th year

- 120 in total



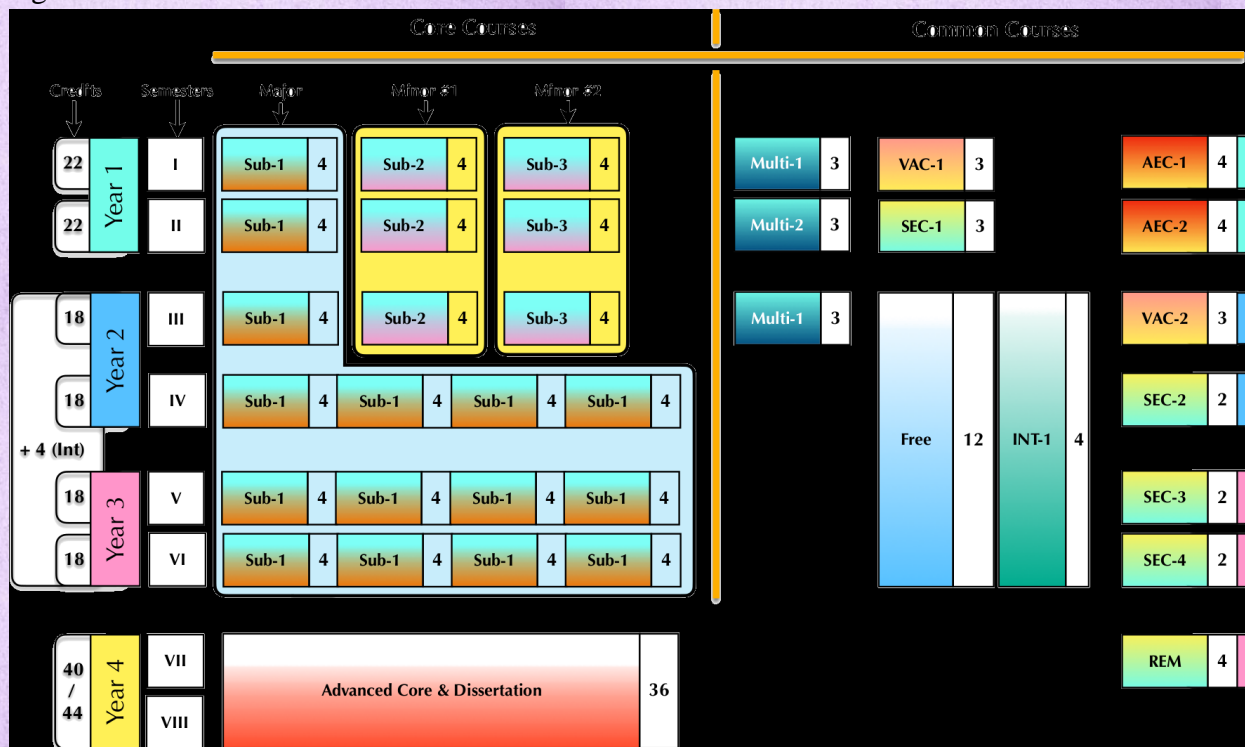

FYUGP degrees & course structures:

The FYUGP at GU is designed to offer two types of Bachelor’s Degrees to the students at the end of the successful completion of the programme—(i) Bachelor’s Degree in a Stream and (ii) Bachelor’s Degree in a Discipline. The word **stream** here refers to Arts, Science, Commerce, and Management. But in our college we can offer Bachelor’s Degree in Arts only. Moreover, the types of degree programme in Arts, course-wise, the whole FYUGP is divided into two parts – (i) Core Courses and (ii) Common Courses.

In the Core Courses there are three options –

- Option for a Major and two Minors.
- Option for a Major and three Minors (Top)
- No Major option or NOM (Bottom).

This time our college will offer major as well as minor options in the following subjects:

Arts Stream

- MIL

Assamese

- Other Language

English

- Social Science

Economics, Education, History, Political Science and Philosophy (minor only)

On the other hand, in terms of common courses it is divided into five subcategories and our college will offer these following subjects under these five subcategories:



- **Multi-disciplinary Courses**

These are 3-credit courses spanning over five different groups of subjects–(i) Natural and Physics Science, (ii) Mathematics, Statistics, and Computer Applications, (iii) Library, Information, and Media Sciences, (iv) Commerce and Management, and (v) Humanities and Social Sciences. The levels of these courses are of Class XII. Each student need to take at any three papers, each with 3-credits from these five sub-groups during Semesters 1-3.

- **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)**

Modern Indian Languages (MIL) – Assamese
English Usage (Communication).

- **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)**

- **Value Added Courses (VAC)**

The VAC courses will come from four sub groups- (i) Understanding India, (ii) Environmental Science, (iii) Digital and Technological Solutions, and (iv) Health & Wellness, Yoga Education, Sports, and Fitness. All together they will have a credit allocation of 6. Each student will have to take any two papers, each of 3-credits, from any three groups during Semesters 1 & 3.

- **Internship**

All students are to carry out an Internship with a credit allocation of 4. The internship can be carried out in any semester during Semesters 3-6. As internships are meant to be done during semester breaks, they will not interfere with other classes.

Brief Glance at the Subjects provided by the College:

At the time of admission into 1st Semester Under Graduate Course a students should take six numbers of courses (or papers) out of which 3 (three) courses are core and 3 (three) courses are common courses as given below:

1. A student is to choose three core courses from the list mentioned below:
 - Economics
 - Education
 - History
 - Political Science and
 - Philosophy.
2. Along with above core courses, a student should choose three common courses one from each sub groups mentioned below:
 - a. Multi-disciplinary Course:
(Humanity and Social Sciences)
 - Basic Economics
 - Political Science
 - History
 - Philosophy
 - Women & Gender Studies.
 - b. Value Added Course:
 - Under Standing India
 - Environment Science
 - Health & Wellness
 - Yoga Education
 - Sports and Fitness.

c. Ability Enhancement Course:

- English Usage (Communication)
- Modern Indian Language (MIL)- Assamese.

Add on Courses / Certificate Courses:

Career Counseling and Skill Based Courses:

The college has signed a MoU with ICT Academy and has organised collaborative programmes, two professional courses on Retail and Communication, one FDP, as well as many other certificate courses. The College has also been providing skill based courses under Pradhan Mantri Kusal Bikas Yojna, the flagship scheme of the ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship.

**ADMISSION PROCEDURE:**

1. Prospectus and admission forms should be collected from the college website www.ratnapithcollege.ac.in.
2. Application for admission into the college must be made through online only by visiting college website www.ratnapithcollege.ac.in and via SAMARTH Portal.
3. Students are selected strictly on the basis of merit. Admission procedure is governed by the college admission rules and the decision taken by the principal will be deemed as final.
4. The College follows the reservation policy as per Govt. of Assam norms.
5. Request and pressure for admission from any quarters is not entertained under any circumstances.
6. Students who passed the qualifying examination in the earlier year(s) (Maximum 2 years) will have to submit an authentic gap certificate issued by a competent authority.
7. Students selected for admission must get themselves admitted on the very day of interview by paying necessary fees failing which they will forfeit their seats.
8. Admission to the College Women's Hostel and Boys' Hostel will be made on merit basis on the day of admission into the college.
9. Guardians and Students are to read the prospectus carefully before filling up and signing the admission form.
10. Scanned copy of the following documents is to be uploaded at the time of filling up online application form.
 - Original Mark sheet, certificate of the last qualifying examination.
 - Certificate from the Head of the Institution last attended.
 - HSLC Examination admit card as age proof or birth certificates.
 - Gap certificate, if necessary
 - Original Caste Certificate from competent Authority.
 - Migration Certificate, if necessary.
 - Income Certificate, if necessary
 - Undertaking of Anti-Ragging



Attendance:

Students must be regular and punctual in attending their classes. It is to be noted that at least 75% attendance is essential for appearing in university exam failing which he/she shall be treated as non-collegiate. A non-collegiate student will have to pay a fine Rs. 375/-. A student failing to attend the classes for 25 days at a stretch from the date of commencement of classes will forfeit his/her seat.

Discipline:

The College authority maintains the following discipline among the students.

- (i) Wearing of complete college uniform is compulsory.
- (ii) Students should always bring their identity card and badge.
- (iii) Use of android mobile phones in the college campus is strictly prohibited.
- (iv) Smoking or chewing of tobacco and 'Paan' in any form is strictly prohibited. Anyone found chewing tobacco or in possession of tobacco within the college campus will be fined and may also be suspended.
- (v) Ragging in any form inside the college premises and in the women's hostel is strictly prohibited. Students indulging in Ragging will be punished severely as per the directives of the Hon'ble Supreme Court/ High Court.
- (vi) Students are strictly warned not to disfigure walls and damage any college property.



COMPUTER COURSE:

The College offers a compulsory computer course to students of Degree 3rd year in order to make them computer literate.

The computer classes will be held within the normal college hours and will be included in the class routine. At the end of the course some course materials and a certificate will be given to those students who will complete the course successfully.



Study Centre of Institute of Distance and Open Learning:

The Study centre of Institute of Distance and Open Learning (IDOL) in our college was established in the year 2005 under the Gauhati University. A candidate who has obtained degree from any university may seek admission for various courses. For more information students may contact IDOL Coordinator, Ratnapith College.

Study Centre of KKHSOU:

Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University (KKHSOU) is a state university offering courses in distance and open mode. Our college study Centre of KKHSOU caters to the needs of the learners who are willing to pursue higher education in the distance and open mode. The centre has been offering BA course since 2013. For any information students may contact the Coordinator, KKHSOU, Ratnapith College.

College Students' Union:

College students' union is the General Body of the students of the College. Every student of the College is the member of the union and the union is elected annually as per the constitution constituted in this regard. Any student willing to offer candidature for contesting the election of Students' Union must have the eligibility criteria as per the verdict of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India.

All notices, hand-bills etc. of the students regarding academic, cultural or literary matters can be circulated or displayed in the Notice Board with prior approval of the principal. Ratnapith College Students' Union shall function according to the guidance and control of the College regulation.



NAAC B+ Grade to Ratnapith College

Peer team of National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) visited Ratnapith College from 25th to 27th October, 2016 and reaccruited the College with B+ Grade. After three days assessment NAAC Peer Team in its report appreciated the College for its prolific academic ambiance.

STUDENTS' SUPPORT SERVICES

Apurba Sinha Granthaghar (College Library)

The College has a well managed, well stocked, and fully computerized central library having more than 20,145 collections of text and reference books. Latest publications in the field of Economics, Education, Political Science, History, Philosophy, Literature etc. are continuously added to the collection. Besides books, the library also subscribes to a good number of periodicals and research journals pertaining to different subjects taught in the college. Popular magazines, various daily and weekly regional & national newspapers etc. are also available in the reading room of the library. It also has a humble collection of digital resources in the form of CD- ROM DVD-ROM.



The entire collection of the library has been converted into machine readable from using a sophisticated library management software SOUL, developed by the INFLIBNET Centre, an autonomous body of the UGC. The library is fully automated providing various housekeeping services to the users using computers such as automated issue & return of Books, access to online catalogues (OPAC), information retrieval using Boolean search operators, author, title, subject searching, database searching, bibliographic services, access to serial database etc. Besides, the library also provides Internet facility over a number of networked computers through LAN to the user of the library for accessing various learning resources on Internet.

The library has the facility to access various online e-resources through a UGC sponsored consortia viz. N-LIST (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content). User of our library can access more than 3,500 online e-journals, more than 74,000 e-books covering a wide range of subjects in the field of social science, humanity etc. The library is also organizing user orientation programme for the freshman ceremony in order to make them familiar into the library systems and procedures.



Departmental Library:

All departments possess a departmental library with good collection of reference books for students and faculty members.

Computer Laboratory:

The College has a computer laboratory with adequate number of computers. The Laboratory is well connected with internet. An Information Technology teacher guides students in the laboratory. In the computer laboratory students can browse internet at free of cost.



Smart Class, Digital Classrooms:

There are sufficient numbers of classrooms available for smooth functioning of the daily academic curriculum. Besides, the College has good number of classrooms with modern ICT along with audio-visual digital facilities.



Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC):

The College has formally constituted an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as a post accreditation quality substance measure as per revised guidelines of the NAAC. The objective of this cell is to maintain quality of the Higher Education in the College. Through this cell constant vigil is maintained on the activities, performances of the students right from the date of his/her admission in the College till the completion of his/her course. Further, the IQAC conducts different programmes pertaining to maintenance of quality.



Career Counseling and Placement Cell:

The Cell tries to create awareness regarding career prospects, self employment, and entrepreneurship development among the students and helps the students in finding and selecting various channels of employment opportunities.

The Cell organizes career related seminar, talks etc. on regular basis for the benefits of the students by inviting competent persons.

The college has an MoU with ICT Academy and has organised collaborative programmes, two professional courses on Retail and Communication, one FDP, as well as many other certificate courses.



Grievance Redressal Cell:

There is a Grievances Redressal Cell to look after the grievances of the students. A complete box has been installed for the purpose. The primary objective of the cell is to redress to grievances of the students as far as practicable so that a congenial academic ambience can be created.



Health Awareness & Fitness Cell:

The Health Care Cell of the College organizes free health check-up thrice in a month for the students of the College. It also organizes seminars and lectures on health issues. The activities are monitored by the coordinator of the health care cell.

Anti-Ragging Committee:

The College has an anti-ragging committee to ensure that no student faces harassment due to ragging. The college has developed a mechanism to address the menace of Ragging College authority is zero tolerant to ragging. Any incidents of ragging will be dealt as per Hon'ble Supreme Court's directions and within government criminal framework.



Women Cell:

The women cell of the College works for the general welfare and safety of the girl students. Generation of awareness on gender specific issues through various workshops and seminars is also one of the foremost concerns. Building a gender friendly atmosphere where girl students can engage in academic pursuit is the avowed mission of the cell.

Seminars and Workshops:

Seminars and workshops, which are integral part of the teaching-learning process, are held by the departments at regular intervals. Resource Persons both from our college and outside are invited as speakers to such Seminars and Workshops. Multi disciplinary seminars are also held in the College and scholars from various fields are invited.



Educational Tour:

Various departments of the College organize educational tours with a view to expose our students with cultures, history and also to familiarize them with the flora and fauna of the country.

Literary Activities:

The College publishes a number of Magazines to encourage the students and faculty in various literacy activities. The College magazine 'Ratnapitham' is published annually by the Students' Union of the

College. A yearly News Bulletin namely "The Ratnapith" is published every year to highlight various activities of the college. Besides, to develop the literary and intellectual quality of the students, all departments of the College bring out Wall Magazine viz. "Prerona" by Assamese Department, "POLITICIA" by Political Science Department, "Shikshan" by Education Department, "DAWN" by English Department, "Economic vision" by Economics Department, "Chandardinga" by History Department and "Jiban Darshan" by Philosophy Department of the College.

Sarat Chandra Sinha Memorial Lecture:

An annual lecture is being arranged by the College authority on the Foundation Day of the College on 1st September every year in the memory of Sarat Chandra Sinha, Former Chief Minister of Assam and Architect of the College. Renowned person from the field of social sciences and humanities is invited to deliver the Memorial Lecture.



Disaster Management Cell:

The Disaster Management Cell of the College works in creating awareness among students and the College community in general about the havoc caused by manmade and natural disasters. The Programme Officer, NSS is the Coordinator of the Cell.

Women's Hostel:

Ratnapith College Women's Hostel is situated within the College campus and it runs under the supervision of Hostel Supervision Committee. The quarter of the hostel superintendent lies at the vicinity of the Hostel. The hostel has well furnished spacious and well-lit rooms. The food catered is hygienically prepared and nutritious. Facility like newspapers, indoor games and a television set are also provided. At present the hostel accommodates 24 boarders who are given admission strictly on merit. The girls' hostel is guided by rules framed by the girls' hostel management committee. Admission fee and other details may be collected from superintendent.



Boys' Hostel:

The college has a newly constructed boys' hostel in the campus equipped with modern facilities. The boarders would be admitted in the hostel from this session itself for which separate hostel admission form is to be filled up. Strict guidelines would be followed in the hostel.



Mini Stadium: College Playground:

Ratnapith College has a mini stadium namely 'Ratnapith Krirakhetra' with a playground measuring 40,000 sq. ft. and with the help of well-wishers a good portion of the gallery has been completed. The Playground is used for Football, Cricket and Athletics.

Gymnasium Facility:

The college has a well-equipped gymnasium hall of almost 2200 sq. ft with different equipment. A physical instructor advises students regarding gymnasium practices.

Games and Sports:

All kinds of sports facilities are provided to the students to develop their skills in sports. Particularly in *Kabaddi*, Volley Ball students have excelled. Besides, different indoor games facilities such as carom, badminton, and chess are also provided to students. The College became the Champion of GU Inter-College Kabadi twice in 2015 and 2016.





Heritage Museum:

The College has a museum since 2004 which depicts the rich cultural and historical heritage of western Assam. The same museum has been renovated in the year 2023 and some more antique pieces are added into it to upgrade its beauty.



Canteen:

The College has a well-furnished canteen to provide food to the students and teaching, non-teaching staff at a subsidized rate. The canteen accommodated in a house measuring about 2100 sq. ft. along with a kitchen.

Auditorium cum Community Hall:

The College Auditorium, Kishore Bhawan near the College canteen has a permanent stage with a capacity of nearly 1000 seats.



Alumni Association:

The Alumni Association of Ratnapith College came into being since 2003 with the noble intention of helping the institution to the fulfillment of its mission. The Association met several times after its formation and took some important decision to help the College in its growth. The Alumni Association, Ratnapith

College, Bahalpur, Chapar has already completed the construction of flag square and has undertaken the construction of the College Boundary Brick Wall. Besides, the Alumni significantly contributed towards the holistic development of the College.

Guardians Meet:

The College authority organizes yearly guardians' meet to share views with them on academic, students' personality development and other matters of all round development of the institution. Particularly guardians help the authority in getting feedback on classes.

National Cadet Corps (NCC):

The college has an active NCC unit under 7 Assam BN NCC where cadets actively participate in the parade of Republic Day and Independence Day along with other such days of National importance. This unit is functioning from the year 2006. This NCC unit provide basic training to students which helps them to get employment in Defense and paramilitary services. Many of the cadets are employed in the various military and paramilitary forces. They also participate in various social welfare activities.



National Service Scheme (NSS):

The College has a very active NSS unit. The unit has been involved in various social service activities like campaign against superstition, witch-hunting, AIDS awareness under the aegis of Red Ribbon Club.



Scholarship:

National Scholarships, State Merit Scholarship, Ishan Uday Scholarship and the scholarship for the students belonging to SC/ST/OBC/MOBC categories are available. The students qualified for this scholarship are to apply within stipulated date as notified by the authority.

Students' Aid Fund:

There is a Students' Aid Fund to provide financial assistance to the poor but meritorious students. The amount of assistance to a needy student is decided by the committee of the Aid Fund.

Dr. Minati Kangsabanik Memorial Scholarship:

Dr. Minati Kangsabanik Memorial Scholarship is instituted from the 2015-16 by the donation given by educationist and husband of Late Dr. M. Kangsabanik Mr. Arun Kangsabanik to the most meritorious student who completed B.A. final examination. The annual award carries Rs. 10,000/- and a certificate. Besides, the college is going to introduce certificate of merit along with an amount of cash to students securing highest marks in each.



Mentor- Mentee Session:

For quality upgradation of the students, the college has introduced the mentor-mentee system to monitor the quality aspects of the students. Mentor will be available to guide the students any time. Mentor will be in constant

touch with the parents regarding the progress of their children.

Assignment Based Test:

The institution has provision of taking regular assignment based tests apart from sessional examination. Student seminar is a regular feature of the course.

Important days and festivals:

Since very beginning the institution is observing some important days and festivals. The main reason behind observing these days and festivals is to create awareness regarding the importance of the same among the students. Some of these important days and festivals observe by the college are likewise- Independence Day, Republic Day, Women's Day, Yoga Day, Aids Day and may more.





Community Engagement:

The institution adopted a nearby village named Nathpara in the year 2024. The college also donated a mini library to the Nathpara L. P. School where it organized a drawing competition in order to encourage the little children. Moreover, some of the antique pieces of the renovated museum of the college are made by a group of the adopted village.
